The 2019-2020 period was one where each of us will have personal memories we will draw upon for the rest of our lives. Highs and Lows, Joy and Sadness, Achievement and Disappointment and many other emotions packed into 366 days. Members of the Mount Lawley Bowling Club will have shared in some or many of your memories – we are a diverse group yet close knit, we spend time together on and off the bowling greens, we want our club to be successful and we are passionate about it.

Not unexpectedly the club suffered a financial loss in 2019-20 and I'm very optimistic that the losses incurred over the last 4-5 years will be replaced by a surplus in the coming and future years.

We lost Reg Armstrong in late February and his sudden passing was felt by all who knew and loved Reg. A treasured member of the club, Reg left a lot of close friends and shared memories –

Thank you to Blaze Bosevski our Bar Manager and the bar staff who worked at various times throughout the year on pennant days, functions, barefoot bowls etc.

Thank you to Russell Edmonds for maintaining and preparing the Club's greens. It's been a tough year health wise for Russell and we wish Russell all the best with his ongoing medical treatment.

A special mention for Roman Grochowski (one of our newer members) who has filled in for Russell on a very regular basis since November 2019. The club is very thankful for Roman's outstanding effort.

My thanks to the Executive Committee – Vice President Laurence Goodman, Treasurer John Fielding, Club Secretary Kim McDermott, Ladies Captain Beth Veitch and Men's Captain Mark Glasson. We have worked well together and your efforts and support are much appreciated.

The Ladies and Men's selectors worked throughout the pennant season to not only select teams but also run around at the last minute to secure substitute players as is often required. Thanks to Maureen O'Dea, Rose Lenzo, Paul Sinden and Tarquin McElvenny.

A very big thank you to our fab four Ladies and Men's Games Committee – Lee Hughes, Maryann Lethlean, Dean Hughes and Kevin Lethlean who did a great job in organising the Club Championship games throughout the year and the Winter Bowls during the pennant off season.

Thank you to Harry Porrins for his coaching efforts with the Ladies pennant players.

Thank you to Helen Hamilton & Maria D'Aurizio for their ongoing work preparing sandwiches for the Men's pennant games.

The effort put in by Dad's Army to maintain the gardens and surrounds was fantastic. This group of men spend a fair percentage of every Monday morning undertaking a variety of activities that help make our club the most visually attractive of all bowling clubs in Western Australia. Well done fellas and in particular well done to Norm Jacobsen for being elevated to Life Member earlier this year.

Thank you to everyone else who volunteered to assist at the club throughout the year – in the kitchen, barefoot bowls coaching, marking for the Consistency Singles, barbecuing for club and other events, setting up and taking down of tables and chairs for pennants and in-house functions, donating goods for raffles, playing for the opposite sex pennant teams to avoid a forfeit and in many other ways.

## **The Year Ahead**

In the coming months we are planning to undertake a conversion of our three greens to a synthetic sand filled surface. This will provide the club with all-year-round playing surfaces and the platform for the club to expand its membership and the use of club facilities.

The exact timing of the conversion work is somewhat uncertain due to the impact of COVID-19. The Mount Lawley Consistency Singles cannot be played as usual in early September and if all goes to plan it will be held late September/early October.

A very big thankyou to members who have been able to assist in this project by loaning the club enough money to cover the shortfall we had after taking into account the City of Stirling, WA Government and Club Cash reserves contributions to the project.

The new Committee will be in a position to focus on building on the Club's 2017 Action Plan, which has a key element of moving to artificial surfaces, in the second half of 2020 and beyond.

I intend to nominate again for President of the Mount Lawley Bowling Club and thank you all for the support you have given me in my first year as President.

# Treasurer's Report 2019-2020

## Introduction

From a financial perspective, this has been another challenging year for the club. In an environment where it is increasingly difficult to increase revenues and reduce costs there were a number of shocks both positive and negative that had a direct influence on the Clubs' bottom line.

The impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic Shut down reduced venue hire and bar sales but was offset to some extent by a Federal Government rescue package which saw the club receive a \$10.5K grant. Staff costs also saw some large swings due to a variety of factors including the COVID-19 shut down, long service leave provisions and a significant workers compensation claim.

In short, the club made a loss of **\$14,785.76** compared to the loss for 2018/19 of \$33,530.77. This is a better than expected result but the fourth year in a row where the club has posted a loss. With the prospect of replacing the playing surfaces next year, it is anticipated the savings in green maintenance will turn this position around and make the club profitable going forward.

## Cash Position

Despite the loss in 2019/20, the club is still in a strong financial position with cash reserves in excess of \$190,000.

In total the cash on hand including investments accounts amounts to **\$191,721.27**. Note the investment account that previously held \$16,186.26 in 2018/19 was withdrawn early in the year to meet cash flow requirements for operating costs.

With the closure of the Bowling Club in late March due to the COVID-19 lockdown, the bar float was banked to the general account with the exception of \$580 in coin.

Overall, the cash position as at the 30<sup>th</sup> of April 2020 is some **\$19,925.25** less than at the same time in 2019 and is perhaps a truer reflection of the actual loss made this year.

## BOWLING CLUB ACTIVITIES

The bowling club activities ran at a \$5K profit this year compared to a loss last year of \$23K. The reasons for this variance are detailed below.

### MEMBERSHIP

- Overall, there was a \$2.1K decline in membership revenues when compared to 2018/19. Ordinary membership receipts were up by \$2.1K as there was a general increase in full members. However, there was a \$4.3K decline in Social memberships as the popularity of the Sunday social bowls declined.

### TOURNAMENTS SPECIAL EVENTS

- Overall, there was a \$3.2K improvement in tournaments and special events
- This was primarily the result of increased pennant fee revenues (green fees paid on pennant days).

### GREENS MAINTENANCE

- Overall, there was a \$30.5K decrease in costs when compared to last year. This was a windfall to the club. The green keeper broke his leg and the workers compensation claim covered his wages during his absence. However, thanks to a contingent of volunteers who managed the green maintenance in his absence, additional salary cost were not required

## FUNDRAISING

- Fundraising activities resulted in \$22.5K of profit this year. Which is a \$7.6K decrease on last year's result.
- Sponsorship was down about \$5K from the previous year. However, last year there was a one-off donation of \$5K for new uniforms, so in actual fact the result was about the same.
- Donations to the club were also down \$2.2K from the previous year.
- The meat pack and other raffles were very successful in raising over \$7.5K. This was a similar to last year's raffle revenue result, when we held the Crust Pizza Raffle.

## MERCHANDISING

- There was a loss this year of \$1.3K. The cost of purchasing new uniform items exceeded the sales. However, the difference is a reflection of the stock in hand which will be sold in the future.

## **GENERAL ACTIVITIES**

Overall, the activities associated with maintaining and hiring the facility, including the running of the bar and hiring the venue ran at a \$19.8K loss for this financial year. This is a \$9.2K increase on the loss of \$10.5K realised in 2018/19.

## BAR

- The profit from the bar was up \$5.7K this year. (i.e.\$97.2K this year compared with \$91.5K last year). The total Bar revenue was up \$5K from last year's result, and the cost associated with running the bar was also down \$0.7K
- The main drivers in reducing costs this year compared with last were
  - \$1.5K more spent on bar stock,
  - \$1.1K less was spent on entertainment
  - \$4.3K less spent on salaries and wages
- Further the Bar maintenance costs were up 2.2K on last year due to the replacement of the faulty POS (Point of Sale) device.

## CLUB HOUSE MAINTENANCE & VENUE HIRE

- The revenue from venue hire was down \$3K when compared to last year. A number of functions had to be cancelled in March and April due to the COVID-19 shut down which impacted the final result.
- Overall, the Clubhouse/Venue hire cost centre, achieved a profit of \$57.1 K this year which is \$5.4K less than last year.

## KITCHEN

- Overall, the Kitchen including the catering for club diners/events made a loss \$4.8K this year which is \$1.5K more than last year.
- This cost centre generally runs at a loss as the Ruben Segal night is partially subsidised by the club. Also, it needs to be recognised that the cost of purchasing supplies for the after-pennant suppers (sandwiches/cheese and biscuits etc.) comes out of this cost centre. However, the revenue from the game fees is realised in the tournaments/special events cost centre. If you recall the revenue for this area was up \$3.2K which goes towards offsetting the loss here.

## GENERAL ADMIN

- Overall, there was a deficit of \$169.3K in General Admin. This is the area where most of the costs associated with running the facility fall.
- This result realised a \$7.6K increase in costs when compared to last year where the loss was \$161.7K.
- Most line items showed small variances up and down with the main increases being
  - \$1K Increase in Computer Expenses
  - \$1.3K Increase in Insurance Premiums
  - \$1.5K increase in Superannuation Costs
  - \$13K expense for Long Service Leave accrual.
- These increases in expenses were mitigated to some extent with a \$10.5 K assistance package grant from the Federal Government to help mitigate the costs of the COVID-19 shut down.

The Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Statement has been included below and have been signed off by Auditor Ken Jeffery.

The Auditor's Result for 2019/20 is qualified and required nil adjustments.
