



A Brief History of Our Club

The Mount Lawley Bowling Club celebrated its Centenary in 2009

1909. The Mount Lawley Bowling Club was founded at the present site.

1912. Originally the Club owned the whole site surrounded by Storthes Street, Rookwood St, Queens Cres and Clifton Cres. The original clubhouse was built around 1912 and was situated between B & C Greens and adjacent to Storthes Street.

1921. At a meeting on 7th September 1921 the Ladies Bowling Club was formed.

1923. In 1923 there were two greens - both under lights.

1934. In February 1934 the first Mixed Carnival was held under lights and lasted one full week. This Carnival continued until 1970 when it was replaced by the first Gala day.

1936. The current Art Deco Clubhouse was built –

1958. In 1958 the Bowling Club took over the Mount Lawley Tennis Courts & Clubhouse. The Mount Lawley Tennis Club, who had shared the site for a number of years, moved to its present location at the corner of Central Ave and Walter Road.

There were four greens and a three rink practice green - all under lights.

1959. About 1959, in a deal with the Council, the ownership of the land was returned to the Council in exchange for the Council building a new clubhouse.

1984. In 1984 the Men's and Ladies' committees combined to organise a week long celebration of the Club's 75th Anniversary

2000. The present Clubhouse was almost completely rebuilt by the City of Stirling in 2000. It was carried out in the Art Deco style as also seen at the Astor Theatre.
